The Secure Airport Public Spaces Act allows airports to use existing Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) funds to update their security infrastructure to better protect public areas, including pick up and drop off areas, as well as baggage claim areas. High profile attacks at Fort Lauderdale (Fla.) Airport and Bishop International Airport in Flint last year demonstrated the vulnerabilities of unsecured public areas at airports, according to the statement. Locally, leadership at the Gerald R. In June 2015, Peters voted for: "Ernst, R-lowa, amendment no. 1549 to the McCain, R-Ariz., substitute amendment no. 1463, to authorize the president to provide direct military assistance to Kurdistan Regional Government military and security forces associated with the Iraqi government to support international coalition efforts against the Islamic State, with that authority lasting for a period of three years. The aid could include anti-tank and anti-armor weapons, armored vehicles, and other military assistance deemed appropriate by the president.
